Almsgiving, Prayer and Fasting

When ye fast—St. Matthew 6:16

In the sixth chapter of his Gospel S. Matthew records what I may have been his own personal memories of our Lord's comparison of the ideals of the kingdom of God with the practice of the professing religious people of His day. The Pharisees considered themselves, and were considered by other people, to be examples of religion, and their practice took form in the three energies of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting.

Our Lord accepts and endorses these three religious activities as the principal acts of the spiritual life. But He teaches a holier motive for each than was as a rule the basis of the religion of the Scribes and Pharisees. With them too often prayer was incantation, almsgiving and fasting self-advertisement, and the reward they sought exterior recognition. Our Lord, as always, lifted what He touched to the sphere of eternity. He showed that almsgiving should really stand for all our relations to others, prayer for all our contacts with God, and that fasting should include all personal self-discipline by which we seek to gain reality in our spiritual lives. In a word, He taught us to seek for reality, and the reward He promised was the attainment to reality.

It is a false spirituality that despises the idea of a reward. It is not the reward, but the character of the reward that is sought, that gives the key to the quality of the action. 'The Father that seeth in secret shall reward you openly' seems to mean that a true interior life will have a quite manifest effect on those who lead it. The person who really prays will become spiritual, the person who really fasts will become free, the person who really gives will become happy.

The ACM met on Sunday, January 9, and elected Bill Jepson President and Donnie Marine Treasurer for 2012. It was noted that we begin this year with a balance of \$1,193 in the treasury.

The ACM will host a Pancake Breakfast for the parish on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, February 19, with Dick Konigsfeld as Chair. All food and supplies will be donated by members, and parishioners may make contributions if they wish.

Plans for 2012 were discussed. The ACM will host at least one theater party, and we are looking at what is being offered by Drury Lane Oak Brook, Pheasant Run in St. Charles and The Rialto Theater in Aurora. A family Miniature Golf Outing will be scheduled this summer, and we hope to have some activity for the Church School children.

Members are asked to bring suggestions for fund-raising activities to the February meeting, with recommendations for projects and charitable causes that we may wish to consider, and we will discuss ways to increase attendance at Morning Prayer Services.

Work has been completed in the Men's Washroom, with new tile on the floor and the north side wall, new ceiling sections in the Undercroft and some necessary professional plumbing repairs. We appreciate what Bob Oschman did to coordinate this project, and the allowance provided by our insurance company more than covers the approximate expense of \$3,400.

In the spring, the heating and air-conditioning ducts in the Undercroft crawl spaces will be wrapped with insulation and seams will be sealed. This will increase the efficiency of the systems and should lower our gas and electric bills. Dan Brush has taken on the responsibility for this project.

The importance of the Parish Annual Meeting, Sunday, January 29, was noted, and sign-up sheets for Altar Flowers and Coffee Hours are available in the Narthex.

All the men in the parish are encouraged to attend the ACM meetings, which will be held monthly, except for August and December.
